Open space petition for Beltline property OK'd for ballot

termined to be registered voters in the city.

The parcel in question is commonly known as the Beltline, a former rail yard located south of Marina Village, bound by Atlantic Avenue and Sherman Street on the north and east. The southern boundary is defined by rear property lines on Eagle Avenue. The Beltline narrows at its western end and has a short frontage on Constitution Way.

City Clerk Diane Felsch will bring the petition to the City Council on Nov. 21.

The council has three choices: introduce

Alameda County Registrar of Voters Brad Clark announced that Jean Sweeney's petition to rezone a 22-acre parcel near Marina Village as open space has qualified for the ballot. Ten percent of Alameda's registered voters — 3,532 — were needed to move the petition forward. The advocates submitted 4,034 signatures; 3,637 were determined to be registered voters in the city.
